Not disseminate information without verifying the facts first.

Avoid unnecessary travel at this time.

Cooperate with the SAPS, members of the National Defence Force or security staff at all times, they are there for our safety and security.

Please remember that these acts of lawlessness are being carried out by a very small number of people. We as South Africans have stood side-by-side before in the interest of the collective good. In the end, good will prevail.
