Some of the highlights this week include:


Gerrit Lotz, VP People and Organisational Effectiveness

As part of the In Our Hands safety campaign, this month Leaders will take you through the Material Unwanted Event (MUE) relating to uncontrolled and unintended contact or movement with or between Trackless Mobile Machines (TMM). This MUE is one of the biggest hazards within the Mining industry and by focusing on the right critical controls we can eliminate serious injuries including permanent disability or a fatality to an employee, contractor, or visitor.

You will learn about where these incidents can occur and the critical controls that need to be in place to prevent it.
